Jhonny Sharma will now
 teach traffic discipline to Bar-
 odians in a new film, *Jhonny
 Chakkas*. The subtle 10-minute
 film on traffic discipline will
 soon premiere in the city.

It was a prestigious moment
 for Barodians when short film
 Jhonny Sharma was declared
 to be the best film within the
 250 short films in a competition
 organised by Zee Studio. Not
 only that the film will also be
 screened in the famous Cannes
 and Berlin film festivals. But
 the directors and the actors of
 this film have not stopped their
 journey. Now character, Jhon-
 ny Sharma, is out to teach traf-
 fic lessons to Barodians in the
 form of a documentary film.
